

The Second Sunday after the Epiphany

January 19, 2025

Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. To one is given through the Spirit the utterance of wisdom, and to another the utterance of knowledge according to the same Spirit, to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, to another the working of miracles, to another prophecy, to another the discernment of spirits, to another various kinds of tongues, to another the interpretation of tongues. All these are activated by one and the same Spirit, who allots to each one individually just as the Spirit chooses. (1 Corinthians 12:4-11)

St. Paul's inspiring teaching on spiritual gifts is a wonderful text to contemplate on this Sunday when we hold our congregation's Annual Meeting. At the Annual Meeting, we hear updates on the ministries of the church, elect lay leaders to various offices, and listen to a presentation on the year's budget. There are so many committed Trinity parishioners and community members who contribute their spiritual gifts to the ministries of our church, and I give thanks for them all. I want to give a particularly big shout-out to warden Lesley Castellini, who is completing her term and rotating off the Vestry. For the past six years, she has been instrumental in helping steer our parish through eventful times: a clergy vacancy, welcoming a new priest, the COVID-19 pandemic, new programs and new employees, and the creation of the Trinity Center for Community. In all this, she has been a faithful, thoughtful, and conscientious leader. Along the way, she also became a Verger, and as she rotates off the vestry, we are so blessed for her ongoing leadership of our worship.

It is a privilege to work with our dedicated group of leaders here at Trinity. From our assisting clergy to the lay staff to vestry members and committee chairs and members, we have excellent leaders. And so, as I prepare to go on my annual vacation next week, I am confident that things will go on just fine without me while I am away. Over the following four Sundays, four different priests will lead services and preach, and I am excited for you all to experience a variety of spiritual gifts at the pulpit and altar. Jill Osis will oversee everyday matters at the church and Trinity Center for Community, and in an emergency, the wardens will manage the situation (consulting with me remotely).

This holiday weekend, we join with our nation, and the world, in remembering the legacy of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. We will also pray for our leaders, as we do each week, as our country prepares for the inauguration of a new president. The convergence of these two occasions should remind us that no matter their party affiliation, our elected leaders have a sacred responsibility to promote freedom, justice, the rule of law, and peace, as well as promoting the dignity and equality of all people. No matter how you voted in November, I encourage you to make sure your voice is heard in holding our leaders accountable to upholding their responsibilities. May Dr. King's prophetic witness guide us and our leaders tomorrow, for the next four years, and always.

Trinity's Racial Justice Audit Report Released

The Racial Justice Project Audit Team has released a report of their findings and recommendations regarding Trinity's efforts to become an anti-racist church. The audit was an extraordinary effort almost two years in the making, and it is available to read online through a link in our Friday email blast. The report examines Trinity's racial history from its founding, a recent history of the Racial Justice Project's programs, findings from a congregational survey, and recommendations for moving forward--which include embedding a racial justice lens within all of our congregation's ministry and to embrace a comprehensive human rights mission. The Vestry heard a presentation on the report from the Rev. Katherine Cunningham at the January meeting, and will further discuss the recommendations at meetings in the coming months. The Rev. Invitation to Join a Church Human Rights Companion Relationship

Friends of Sabeel North America invite congregations to join a pilot solidarity program in which 12 houses of worship will pair up with a detained Palestinian Christian. Participants must commit to a full year. Ministry will include: Communicate with the family of the befriended detainee, get familiar with his/her legal case, communicate with the lawyer, send cards and letters to the detainee and his family member, pray for the detainee weekly in church and elsewhere; continue to learn and share with their church about the conditions the detainee endures; advocacy action to their congregation to address injustice, such as, letter writing to consular officials, US government officials, the Red Cross, and religious leaders. Please let either the Rev. Katherine Cunningham or the Rev. Geoff Curtiss know of your interest as soon as possible so we can assess whether we have enough interested team members.
