¹⁴ I am poured out like water; all my bones are out of joint; *

my heart within my breast is melting wax. ¹⁵ My mouth is dried out like a pot-sherd; my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; * and you have laid me in the dust of the grave. ¹⁶ Packs of dogs close me in. and gangs of evildoers circle around me; * they pierce my hands and my feet; I can count all my bones. ¹⁷ They stare and gloat over me; * they divide my garments among them; they cast lots for my clothing. 18 Be not far away, O Lord; * you are my strength; hasten to help me. ¹⁹ Save me from the sword. * my life from the power of the dog. ²⁰ Save me from the lion's mouth, * my wretched body from the horns of wild bulls. ²¹ I will declare your Name to my brethren; * in the midst of the congregation I will praise you. ²² Praise the Lord, you that fear him; * stand in awe of him, O offspring of Israel; all you of Jacob's line, give glory. ²³ For he does not despise nor abhor the poor in their poverty; neither does he hide his face from them; * but when they cry to him he hears them. ²⁴ My praise is of him in the great assembly; * I will perform my vows in the presence of those who worship him. ²⁵ The poor shall eat and be satisfied, and those who seek the Lord shall praise him: * "May your heart live for ever!" ²⁶ All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the Lord. * and all the families of the nations shall bow before him. ²⁷ For kingship belongs to the Lord; * he rules over the nations. ²⁸ To him alone all who sleep in the earth bow down in worship; * all who go down to the dust fall before him. ²⁹ My soul shall live for him; my descendants shall serve him; * they shall be known as the Lord's for ever. ³⁰ They shall come and make known to a people yet unborn * the saving deeds that he has done.

The Old Testament Lesson

A reading from the book of Wisdom 1:16-2:1,2:12-22 ¹⁶ But the ungodly by their words and deeds summoned death; considering him a friend, they pined away and made a covenant with him, because they are fit to belong to his company. ¹For they reasoned unsoundly, saying to themselves, 'Short and sorrowful is our life, and there is no remedy when a life comes to its end, and no one has been known to return from Hades. ¹² 'Let us lie in wait for the righteous man. because he is inconvenient to us and opposes our actions; he reproaches us for sins against the law, and accuses us of sins against our training. ¹³ He professes to have knowledge of God, and calls himself a child of the Lord. ¹⁴ He became to us a reproof of our thoughts; 15 the very sight of him is a burden to us, because his manner of life is unlike that of others. and his ways are strange. ¹⁶ We are considered by him as something base, and he avoids our ways as unclean; he calls the last end of the righteous happy, and boasts that God is his father. ¹⁷ Let us see if his words are true, and let us test what will happen at the end of his life; ¹⁸ for if the righteous man is God's child, he will help him, and will deliver him from the hand of his adversaries. ¹⁹ Let us test him with insult and torture, so that we may find out how gentle he is, and make trial of his forbearance. ²⁰ Let us condemn him to a shameful death, for, according to what he says, he will be protected.' ²¹ Thus they reasoned, but they were led astray, for their wickedness blinded them, ²² and they did not know the secret purposes of God, nor hoped for the wages of holiness, nor discerned the prize for blameless souls; The Word of the Lord. The New Testament Lesson

A reading from the first letter of Peter 1:10-20

¹⁰Concerning this salvation, the prophets who prophesied of the grace that was to be yours made careful search and inquiry, ¹¹inquiring about the person or time that the Spirit of Christ within them indicated when it testified in advance to the sufferings destined for Christ and the subsequent glory. ¹²It was revealed to them that they were serving not themselves but you, in regard to the things that have now been announced to you through those who brought you good news by the Holy Spirit sent from heaven things into which angels long to look! ¹³Therefore prepare your minds for action; discipline yourselves; set all your hope on the grace that Jesus Christ will bring you when he is revealed. ¹⁴Like obedient children, do not be conformed to the desires that you formerly had in ignorance. ¹⁵Instead, as he who called you is holy, be holy yourselves in all your conduct; 16 for it is written, "You shall be holy, for I am holy." ¹⁷If you invoke as Father the one who judges all people impartially according to their deeds, live in reverent fear during the time of your exile. ¹⁸You know that you were ransomed from the futile ways inherited from your ancestors, not with perishable things like silver or gold, ¹⁹but with the precious blood of Christ, like that of a lamb without defect or blemish. ²⁰He was destined before the foundation of the world but was revealed at the end of the ages for vour sake.
