Peace in heaven and glory in the highest. (Palm Sunday liturgy, Book of Common Prayer)

We are entering Holy Week, the Church's yearly pilgrimage with Jesus to the foot of the Cross and to the Empty Tomb. Holy Week begins and ends in joy, but between Palm Sunday's Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem and the Resurrection of Easter, we walk with Jesus toward Calvary. As we journey with Jesus, the events of those fateful days come alive inside us and in the midst of our church community. I know that everyone cannot be present for every service, but I encourage you to attend as many as you can. Monday through Saturday, between Palm Sunday and Easter, we will have daily services at 7 pm, as well as an additional noon liturgy on Good Friday and prayers on Holy Saturday morning.

Holy Week is about remembrance, but not just sharing a memory. We re-member the story by placing ourselves in the midst of the events, through our liturgies. We worship an incarnate God, a God who became human, and as we walk with Jesus, we become part of the story. The Crucifixion and Resurrection were events in history, but they also come alive inside us and in the midst of our community when we remember them. As we journey with Jesus to the Cross, we stand in solidarity with all those who suffer around the world. Through our worship and service, prayer and action, we join with God in co-creating a new reign of peace and human flourishing, one in which we can wave hosannas and cry "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord."
